 - First Lego League (FLL) Competition Robotics Team: Animal Allies Challenge (how humans and animals interact)
 - Reviewed Reindeer pen, met with keeper, discussed various issues being faced
 - Discussed solutions with MNRF researcher i.e. Plexiglass fence (so deer tongues don't get stuck on metal in winter)
 - Keep animals in mind with changes for Master Plan
 - Built a 3D clay model; incorporated features such as larger pen
 - Presented to Sarah Doucette & John Formosa Nov 3rd
 - Won FLL's Research Award!
 - Sarah Doucette: Ideas will be considered during Master Plan's Phase 2 during renovation of animal enclosures; hoping similar input for other pens
 - John: EPDI consultants are being engaged to assist with animal pen layout
